CONSENT ORDER

In or around May 2026, the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) initiated an investigation of **ADAM DWYER**, License Number A0001344, after discovering that he practiced athletic training in Maryland without a license. At the conclusion of its investigation, Panel B determined that it has grounds to charge the Respondent with failing to comply with the provisions of the Maryland Athletic Trainers Act (the “Act”), Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. §§ 14-5D-1 *et seq.* (LexisNexis Supp. 2025).

The pertinent provisions of the Act are as follows:

Health Occ. § 14-5D-17. License required to practice athletic training.

Unless authorized to practice athletic training under this subtitle, a person may not:

(1) Practice athletic training in this State[.]

Prior to the issuance of disciplinary charges, the Respondent agreed to enter into this Consent Order, consisting of Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order, and Consent.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Panel B finds the following facts:

1. The Respondent originally was licensed to practice as an athletic trainer in the State of Maryland on September 8, 2020. The Respondent renewed his license to practice as an athletic trainer on or about September 13, 2023, with a license expiration date of September 30, 2025.

2. On May 23, 2023, the Respondent was hired as an Injury Prevention Specialist for a company (the “Company”) that employs and places health care professionals, including athletic trainers, with clients to promote workplace health, safety and injury prevention.

3. The Company placed the Respondent at a client’s workplace located in Hagerstown, Maryland.

4. As a condition of employment, the Respondent was required to have an active athletic trainer’s license. The Company’s job description for the Respondent set forth that as a “certified athletic trainer,” the Respondent was to “deliver on-the-job care and evaluate injury risks using computer vision tools, schedule and conduct preventative and early intervention appointments, rehabilitate non-work-related injuries, partner with safety professionals and ergonomists to implement wellness programs, leverage data analytics to assess injuries and implement effective solutions, and collaborate on innovative programs to improve overall worker health.”

5. The Respondent’s license to practice as an athletic trainer in the State of Maryland expired on September 30, 2025.

6. Despite the expiration of his license in the State of Maryland, the Respondent continued to work as an athletic trainer for the Company.

7. On March 30, 2026, the Respondent filed an Athletic Trainer Application for Reinstatement of License with the Board.

8. On April 29, 2026, the Board approved the Respondent's Athletic Trainer Application for Reinstatement.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, Panel B concludes as a matter of law that the Respondent practiced athletic training in Maryland without a license which constitutes a violation of Health Occ. § 14-5D-17(1).

ORDER

It is, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum of Panel B, hereby:

ORDERED that, **within ONE YEAR** from the effective date of this Consent Order, the Respondent shall pay a civil fine of **FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500)**. The payment shall be by bank certified check or money order made payable to the Maryland Board of Physicians, P.O. Box 37217, Baltimore, Maryland 21297. The Board will not renew or reinstate the Respondent's license if the Respondent fails to pay the fine; and it is further

ORDERED that the effective date of the Consent Order is the date the Consent Order is signed by the Executive Director of the Board or her designee. The Executive Director or her designee signs the Consent Order on behalf of the disciplinary panel which has imposed the terms and conditions of this Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that this Consent Order shall not be amended or modified and future requests for modification will not be considered; and it is further,

ORDERED that this Consent Order is a public document. *See* Health Occ. §§ 1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Gen. Prov. § 4-333(b)(6) (LexisNexis Supp. 2025).

comprehend the language and meaning of its terms.

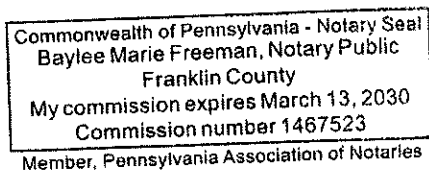

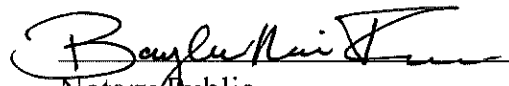
