ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

On May 22, 2024, Disciplinary Panel B (the “Panel”) of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) and Alan Vinitzky, M.D., entered into a Consent Order, wherein the Panel concluded, as a matter of law, that Dr. Vinitzky failed to meet the appropriate standards as determined by appropriate peer review for the delivery of quality medical and surgical care performed in an outpatient facility, office hospital, or any other location in this State, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(22); and failed to keep adequate medical records as determined by appropriate peer review, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(40).¹

Pursuant to the Consent Order, Dr. Vinitzky was reprimanded and placed on probation for a minimum period of two (2) years with the following probationary terms and conditions: 1) pay a civil fine of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) within one (1) year; 2) successfully complete a course in medical documentation within six (6) months; and 3) be subject to supervision for one (1) year by a disciplinary panel-approved supervisor who is board-certified in pediatrics or family medicine.

Dr. Vinitzky has fully and satisfactorily complied with all of the terms and conditions of probation imposed by the May 22, 2024 Consent Order and two (2) years have passed.

It is thus, by the Panel, hereby

ORDERED that the probation and probationary terms and conditions imposed by the May 22, 2024 Consent Order are **TERMINATED**; and it is further

ORDERED that the reprimands imposed by the June 28, 1995, October 18, 2018, and May 22, 2024 Consent Orders remain in effect; and it is further

ORDERED that the permanent prohibitions on prescribing all Controlled Dangerous Substances (“CDS”) and issuing written certifications to patients for medical cannabis treatment imposed in the October 18, 2018 Consent Order remain in effect; and it is further

ORDERED that in emergency cases, Dr. Vinitzky may issue no more than one prescription for a CDS medication for each patient per year, but the prescription may not exceed the lowest effective dose and quantity needed for a duration of **five (5) days**. The prescription may not be refilled, or may it be renewed. Dr. Vinitzky shall notify the Board within twenty-four (24) hours of any prescription written under the authority of this paragraph; and it is further

ORDERED that this is a public document.
