ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

On November 17, 2020, Disciplinary Panel A (the “Panel”) of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) and Edward J. Arrison (the “Respondent”) entered into a Consent Order, wherein the Panel concluded, as a matter of law, that the Respondent was guilty of unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(3)(ii); was professionally, physically, or mentally incompetent, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(4); habitually intoxicated, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(7); provided professional services while under the influence of alcohol, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(9)(i); willfully made or filed a false report or record in the practice of medicine, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(11); and willfully made a false representation when seeking or making application for licensure or any other application related to the practice of medicine, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(36).

Pursuant to the November 17, 2020 Consent Order, the Respondent’s license to practice medicine was suspended for a minimum period of one (1) year with suspension terms and conditions including that he enroll in the Maryland Professional Rehabilitation Program (“MPRP”). The November 17, 2020 Consent Order also provided that after the minimum period of one (1) year, the Respondent could submit a written petition to the Panel for termination of

suspension, upon the Board's receipt of a report from MPRP that he had complied with all of MPRP's requirements and was safe to return to the practice of medicine.

On March 16, 2022, after petitioning the Panel to terminate the suspension of his Maryland medical license and MPRP's endorsement of his return to clinical practice, the Panel issued the Respondent an Order on Petition to Terminate Suspension of Medical License ("Order Terminate Suspension").¹

The Order Terminate Suspension terminated the November 17, 2020 Consent Order and ordered that the permanent condition set forth in the November 7, 2013 Consent Order remain in effect. Additionally, the Order Terminate Suspension placed the Respondent on probation for a minimum period of four (4) years with probationary terms and conditions, including that he obtain the Panel's approval of any practice setting in which he intends to practice medicine and keep the Board informed of any subsequent employment changes within five (5) days of the change, shall not practice medicine as a solo practitioner or make house calls, and shall remain enrolled in MPRP.

The Respondent has fully and satisfactorily complied with all terms and conditions of probation imposed by the March 16, 2022 Order on Petition to Terminate Suspension of Medical License and four (4) years have passed.

It is thus, by the Panel, hereby

ORDERED that the probation and probationary terms and conditions imposed by the March 16, 2022 Order on Petition to Terminate Suspension of Medical License are **TERMINATED**; and it is further

ORDERED that the permanent condition imposed by the November 17, 2013 remain in effect. As required by that Consent Order, the Respondent shall not practice pain management. The Respondent, however, may order, prescribe, and administer controlled dangerous substances (CDS) but only as part of his practice of anesthesiology, and only perioperatively; and it is further

ORDERED that the respective reprimands imposed by the July 25, 2007 and November 17, 2013 Consent Orders remain in effect;

ORDERED that this is a public document.
