TERMINATION OF CDS PROHIBITION

On July 10, 2026, Disciplinary Panel B (the “Panel”) of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) Harpal S. Mangat, M.D., entered into a Consent Order wherein the Panel concluded, as a matter of law, that Dr. Mangat failed to meet appropriate standards as determined by appropriate peer review for the delivery of quality medical and surgical care performed in an outpatient facility, office, hospital, or any other location in this State, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(22); and failed to keep adequate medical records as determined by appropriate peer review, in violation of Health Occ. § 1-404(a)(40).¹

Under the terms of the Consent Order, Dr. Mangat was reprimanded, placed on probation for a minimum period of ONE (1) YEAR with probationary terms and conditions which included completing courses in controlled dangerous substances (“CDS”) prescribing and medical record keeping within six months, and a prohibition from prescribing and dispensing all CDS until after he had successfully completed the CDS prescribing course.² Furthermore, the Consent Order provided that the prescribing and dispensing prohibition may be administratively terminated through an Order of the Panel upon Dr. Mangat’s completion of the CDS prescribing course.

On July 25, 2026, Dr. Mangat completed a course in CDS prescribing.

² The prohibition on prescribing and dispensing went into effect forty-five calendar days after the effective date of the Consent Order to give Dr. Mangat adequate time to transition patients to other providers.

It is thus, by the Panel, hereby

ORDERED that the prohibition on prescribing and dispensing all CDS is **TERMINATED**; and it is further

ORDERED that the **REPRIMAND, PROBATION**³ and the probationary terms and conditions imposed by the Consent Order remain in effect; and it is further

ORDERED that Dr. Mangat shall not apply for early termination of probation; and it is further

ORDERED that a violation of probation constitutes a violation of the Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that, after Dr. Mangat has complied with all terms and conditions of probation, and the minimum period of probation imposed by the Consent Order has passed, Dr. Mangat may submit to the Board a written petition for termination of probation. After consideration of the petition, the probation may be terminated through an order of the disciplinary panel. Dr. Mangat may be required to appear before the disciplinary panel to discuss his petition for termination. The disciplinary panel may grant the petition to terminate the probation through an order of the disciplinary panel, if Dr. Mangat has complied with all probationary terms and conditions and there are no pending complaints related to the charges; and it is further

ORDERED that, if Dr. Mangat allegedly fails to comply with any term or condition imposed by the Consent Order, Dr. Mangat shall be given notice and an opportunity for a hearing. If the disciplinary panel determines there is a genuine dispute as to a material fact, the hearing shall be before an Administrative Law Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings,

followed by an exceptions process before a disciplinary panel; and if the disciplinary panel determines there is no genuine dispute as to a material fact, Dr. Mangat shall be given a show cause hearing before a disciplinary panel; and it is further

ORDERED that after the appropriate hearing if the disciplinary panel determines that Dr. Mangat has failed to comply with any term or condition imposed by the Consent Order, the disciplinary panel may reprimand Dr. Mangat, place him on probation with appropriate terms and conditions, or suspend with appropriate terms and conditions, or revoke his license to practice medicine in Maryland. The disciplinary panel may, in addition to one or more of the sanctions set forth above, impose a civil monetary fine on Dr. Mangat; and it is further

ORDERED that the effective date of this Termination of CDS Prohibition is the date the Termination of CDS Prohibition is signed by the Executive Director of the Board or her designee. The Executive Director signs the Termination of CDS Prohibition on behalf of the disciplinary panel which has imposed the terms and conditions of this Order, and it is further

ORDERED that Dr. Mangat is responsible for all costs incurred in fulfilling the terms and conditions of the Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that this Order is a public document. *See* Health Occ. §§ 1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Gen. Prov. § 4-333(b)(6).
