ORDER TERMINATING SUSPENSION AND IMPOSING PROBATION

PROCEDURAL AND FACTUAL HISTORY

On March 26, 2025, Disciplinary Panel A (“Panel A” or the “Panel”) of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (“the Board”) summarily suspended the Maryland medical license of Jennifer Wormuth, M.D. On April 10, 2025, the Panel affirmed the summary suspension. On August 27, 2025, Dr. Wormuth and the Panel entered into a Consent Order. Under the terms of the Consent Order, Panel A reprimanded Dr. Wormuth, suspended Dr. Wormuth’s medical license for a minimum period of one year with a retroactive start date of March 26, 2025, required Dr. Wormuth to complete a course in professionalism and required Dr. Wormuth to enroll in the Maryland Professional Rehabilitation Program (“MPRP”) with monitoring and quarterly reports from MPRP. The Consent Order also terminated the summary suspension as moot. Further, the Consent Order provided that, after the minimum one-year suspension period, if MPRP determines that Dr. Wormuth is safe to practice medicine and has complied with MPRP’s recommendations and requirements, she could petition Panel A to terminate the suspension and that, if the suspension is terminated, Panel A could impose conditions on her return to practice.

PETITION FOR TERMINATION OF SUSPENSION

On March 26, 2026, Dr. Wormuth petitioned the Board for the termination of her suspension. Dr. Wormuth completed the coursework required by the Consent Order. The Board also received, as part of her Petition, a report from MPRP that stated, “Dr. Wormuth has been fully cooperative with her MPRP rehabilitation plan and all recommendations. Additionally, all toxicology analyses have been negative for non-prescribed/prohibited substances, and all her treatment reports have been positive.” Ultimately, MPRP concluded, “[o]ur full clinical team has discussed this case extensively and we endorse her return to clinical practice.” On April 8, 2026, the Administrative Prosecutor filed a response, recommending terminating the suspension and imposing probation with the condition that she continue her participation in MPRP and fully comply with all MPRP recommendations and requirements. On May 13, 2026, Panel A convened as a Reinstatement Inquiry Panel, with Dr. Wormuth, her counsel, and an Administrative Prosecutor for the State, for the Panel to consider Dr. Wormuth’s petition to terminate the suspension of her license.

CONSIDERATION OF PETITION

Panel A finds that Dr. Wormuth has complied with the terms of the Consent Order and, based on the recommendations and evaluations presented, is safe to return to the practice of medicine with the continuation of terms and conditions. The Panel believes that Dr. Wormuth should remain on probation and enrolled in MPRP for a minimum of

five years from the date of this Order Terminating Suspension and Imposing Probation (“Order”) and until her successful discharge from MPRP.

ORDER

It is, thus, by Panel A, hereby

ORDERED that the suspension imposed, under the August 27, 2025 Consent Order, is **TERMINATED**; and it is further

ORDERED that Dr. Wormuth is placed on **PROBATION** for a minimum period of **FIVE YEARS** and until she is successfully discharged from the Maryland Professional Rehabilitation Program (MPRP).¹ During the probationary period, Dr. Wormuth shall comply with the following probationary terms and conditions:

1. Dr. Wormuth shall remain enrolled in the Maryland Professional Rehabilitation Program and shall:
 - (a) continue her Participant Rehabilitation Agreement and Participant Rehabilitation Plan with MPRP or be entered into an amended or new Participant Rehabilitation Agreement and Participant Rehabilitation Plan as determined by MPRP;
 - (b) fully and timely cooperate and comply with all MPRP’s referrals, rules, and requirements, including, but not limited to, the terms and conditions of the Participant Rehabilitation Agreement and Participant Rehabilitation Plan entered into with MPRP, and shall fully participate and comply with all therapy, treatment, evaluations, and screenings as directed by MPRP;
 - (c) sign and update the written release/consent forms requested by the Board and MPRP, including release/consent forms to authorize MPRP to make verbal and written disclosures to the Board and to authorize the Board to disclose relevant information from MPRP records and files in a public order. Dr. Wormuth shall not withdraw her release/consent;

¹ If Dr. Wormuth’s license expires while she is on probation, the probationary period and any probationary conditions will be tolled.

(d) sign and update the written release/consent forms as requested by the Board and MPRP. Dr. Wormuth shall sign the release/consent forms to authorize MPRP to make verbal and written disclosures to the Board, including disclosure of any and all MPRP records and files possessed by MPRP. Dr. Wormuth shall also sign any written release/consent forms to authorize MPRP to exchange with (i.e., disclose to and receive from) outside entities (including all of Dr. Wormuth's current therapists and treatment providers) verbal and written information concerning Dr. Wormuth and to ensure that MPRP is authorized to receive the medical records of Dr. Wormuth, including, but not limited to, mental health and drug or alcohol treatment records. Dr. Wormuth shall not withdraw her release/consent;

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if, upon the authorization of MPRP, Dr. Wormuth transfers to a rehabilitation program in another state, her failure to comply with any term or condition of the out-of-state's rehabilitation program constitutes a violation of this Order. Dr. Wormuth shall also sign any out-of-state written release/consent forms to authorize the Board to exchange with (i.e., disclose to and receive from) the out-of-state program verbal and written information concerning Dr. Wormuth, and to ensure that the Board is authorized to receive her medical records, including, but not limited to, mental health and drug or alcohol evaluation and treatment records. Dr. Wormuth shall not withdraw the release/consent; and it is further

ORDERED that, after a minimum period of **FIVE YEARS**, if Dr. Wormuth has complied with all terms and conditions of probation, and upon MPRP's determination that she can safely practice medicine without additional monitoring, Dr. Wormuth may submit a written petition to the Board requesting termination of probation. After consideration of the petition, the probation may be terminated through an order of Panel A. Dr. Wormuth may be required to appear before Panel A to discuss her petition for termination of probation or the Panel may choose to administratively terminate the probation. Panel A

will grant the petition to terminate the probation if Dr. Wormuth has complied with all of the probationary terms and conditions, MPRP determines that Dr. Wormuth can safely practice medicine without additional monitoring, and there are no pending complaints related to the charges; and it is further

ORDERED that a violation of probation constitutes a violation of this Order; and it is further

ORDERED that, if Dr. Wormuth allegedly fails to comply with any term or condition of this Order, Dr. Wormuth shall be given notice and an opportunity for a hearing. If there is a genuine dispute as to a material fact, the hearing shall be before an Administrative Law Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings and, if there is no genuine dispute as to a material fact, Dr. Wormuth shall be given a show cause hearing before Panel A; and it is further

ORDERED that, after the appropriate hearing, if Panel A determines that Dr. Wormuth has failed to comply with any term or condition of this Order, Panel A may reprimand Dr. Wormuth, place Dr. Wormuth on further probation with appropriate terms and conditions, or suspend her license with appropriate conditions, or revoke Dr. Wormuth's license to practice medicine in Maryland. Panel A may, in addition to one or more of the sanctions set forth above, impose a civil monetary fine upon Dr. Wormuth; and it is further

ORDERED that there shall be no early termination of probation; and it is further

ORDERED that Dr. Wormuth is responsible for all costs incurred in fulfilling the terms and conditions of this Order; and it is further

ORDERED that any time period prescribed in this Order begins when this Order goes into effect. This Order goes into effect upon the signature of the Board's Executive Director, who signs on behalf of Panel A; and it is further

ORDERED that this Order is a public document, pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. §§ 1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Gen. Prov. § 4-333(b)(6).
