FINAL ORDER

PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

The Maryland Board of Physicians (the “Maryland Board”) received information that Jonathan S. Guirguis, D.O. (the “Respondent”), Maryland License Number H0095419, a physician licensed to practice medicine in Maryland via the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (the “Compact”), was disciplined by the Michigan Board of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery (the “Michigan Board”). In a Consent Order (the “Michigan Order”), dated April 23, 2026, the Respondent permanently surrendered his license to practice as an osteopathic physician in the state of Michigan. A copy of the Michigan Order is attached hereto.

Based on the above-mentioned Michigan Board sanction, the Maryland Board is authorized to discipline the Respondent, pursuant to Health Occ. §14-3A-01, Section 10.

Health Occ. §14-3A-01, Interstate Medical Licensure Compact, Section 10 Disciplinary Actions provides:

- (a) Any disciplinary action taken by any member board against a physician licensed through the Compact shall be deemed unprofessional conduct that may be subject to discipline by other member boards, in addition to any violation of the Medical Practice Act or regulations in that state.
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- (c) If disciplinary action is taken against a physician by a member board not in the state of principal license, any other member board may deem the action conclusive as to matter of law and fact decided; and

(1) Impose the same or lesser sanction(s) against the physician so long as such sanctions are consistent with the Medical Practice Act of that state.]

Maryland Board Disciplinary Panel A (“Panel A”) has determined that the acts for which the Respondent was disciplined in Michigan would be grounds for disciplinary action under H.O. §14-404(a)(3)(ii) and (43) is further deemed unprofessional conduct under Health Occ. 14-3A-01, Section 10(a).

With respect to Health Occ. §14-404(a)(43), the pertinent Maryland statute and regulations are the following:

Maryland Statutes Health Occupations Title 14

....

§14-316. Expiration, renewal, and reinstatement

(c)(1) Before the license expires, the licensee periodically may renew it for an additional term, if the licensee:

(iv) Submits to the Board:

(2) Satisfactory evidence of compliance with any continuing education requirements set under this section for license renewal[.]

Code of Maryland Regulations

....

COMAR 10.32.01.08. Renewals

....

H. A licensee applying for renewal shall complete the CME requirements as defined in Regulation .10 of this chapter[.]

....

COMAR 10.32.01.10. Continuing Medical Education

....

- D. On the application form for renewal or reinstatement, the applicant shall attest to the fact that the applicant has completed the CME requirement[.]

FINDINGS OF FACT

Under Health Occ. § 14-3A-01 Section 10(c), a compact member board may deem the facts in any disciplinary action taken against a physician by a member board to be conclusive as a matter of fact decided. Accordingly, Panel A makes the following findings of fact:

1. The Respondent was licensed to practice medicine in the State of Maryland on or about August 26, 2022, under License Number H0095419.
2. On or about February 24, 2026, the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs audited the Respondent's continuing education requirements and determined that the Respondent was in deficit of 92 out of the 150 continuing education hours required for licensure.
3. By Order dated April 23, 2026, the Respondent permanently surrendered his Michigan osteopathic physician license "in lieu of paying a fine and completing continuing education."

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, based on the Michigan Board's Conclusions of Law, and based on Health Occ. §14-3A-01 Section 10(a) and (c), Panel A concludes as a matter of law that the Respondent "is guilty of [u]nprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine," and "[...] violates any provision of this title, any rule or

regulation adopted by the Board, or any State or federal law pertaining to the practice of medicine,” in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(3)(ii) and (43).

SANCTION

Pursuant to Health Occ. §14-3A-01, Interstate Medical Licensure Compact, Section 10(c)(1), the Maryland Board may impose the same or lesser sanction against the physician so long as such sanctions are consistent with the Maryland Medical Practice Act. Panel A deems the permanent surrender to be akin to a permanent revocation and will impose the lesser sanction of revocation.

ORDER

It is, thus, by Panel A, hereby:

ORDERED that the Respondent’s medical license in the State of Maryland is **REVOKED**, and it is further

ORDERED that this Final Order is a public document. *See* Health Occ. §§1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Gen. Prov. §4-333(b)(6).
