**ORDER LIFTING SUSPENSION AND  
REINSTATING PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT LICENSE**

On January 29, 2019, the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the "Board") issued an Order of Suspension of Physician Assistant License for Delinquent Child Support ("Order of Suspension") against Fahim Nadir Kashif, PA-C, License Number C03457 (the "Respondent"). Pursuant to Maryland Family Law Code Ann. ("Fam. Law") § 10-119.3(e)(2)(i) (2006 Repl. Vol. and 2009 Supp.), upon request of the Baltimore City Office of Child Support Enforcement Administration of the Maryland Department of Human Resources (the "Administration"), the Board suspended Respondent's license to practice medicine in Maryland for Respondent's delinquent child support payments.

On February 11, 2019, the Board received a Notice to Reinstate Respondent's license from the Administration. Pursuant to the Medical Practice Act, Maryland Health Occ. Code Ann. §§ 14-101 *et seq.*, Respondent otherwise qualifies for a license.


Therefore, pursuant to Fam. Law § 10-119.3(k), on this 12<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2019, by the Maryland State Board of Physicians, it is hereby

**ORDERED** that the suspension of the Maryland physician assistant license of Fahim Nadir Kashif, PA-C is **LIFTED**; and it is further

**ORDERED** that the Maryland physician assistant license of Fahim Nadir Kashif, PA-C is **REINSTATED** without restrictions or conditions; and it is further

**ORDERED** that this is a Final Order of the Maryland State Board of Physicians and, as such, is a Public Document and is reportable to any entity to which the Board is obligated by law to report, and is disclosable under the Maryland Public Information Act, Md. Code Ann., Gen. Prov. §§4-101 through 4-601 (2014).
