ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

On January 2, 2019, Disciplinary Panel A (the “Panel”) of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) issued an Order for Summary Suspension of License to Practice Medicine, wherein the Panel summarily suspended Jesus A. Burbano, M.D.’s Maryland medical license. On January 17, 2019, the summary suspension was affirmed.

On May 9, 2019, the Panel and Dr. Burbano entered into a Consent Order, wherein the Panel concluded, as a matter of law, that Dr. Burbano was guilty of unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine, professionally, physically, or mentally incompetent, and addicted to, or habitually abuses, any narcotic or controlled dangerous substance as defined in § 5-101 of the Criminal Law Article. The Consent Order terminated the Order for Summary Suspension and suspended Dr. Burbano’s license to practice medicine for a minimum period of one (1) year from the date of the Order for Summary Suspension with terms and conditions, including, that he enrolls in the Maryland Professional Rehabilitation Program (“MPRP”) and comply with all of MPRP’s referrals, rules, and requirements. The Consent Order further ordered that Dr. Burbano may submit a written petition to the Panel to terminate the suspension after the minimum period of one (1) year and once MPRP determined and notified the Board that he was safe to return to the practice of medicine.

On January 7, 2020, after concluding that Dr. Burbano violated the condition of the May 9, 2019 Consent Order that required him to comply with the terms and conditions of his Rehabilitation Agreement with MPRP, the Panel issued an Order After Show Cause Hearing, wherein the suspension imposed by the May 19, 2019 Consent Order was extended for a minimum of six (6) months from the effective date of the Order After Show Cause Hearing. The Panel also ordered Dr. Burbano to continue his participation in MPRP and comply with all of MPRP's referrals, rules, and requirements. The Order After Show Cause Hearing further ordered that Dr. Burbano may submit a written petition to the Panel to terminate the suspension after the minimum period of six (6) months and once MPRP determined and notified the Board that he was safe to return to the practice of medicine.

On October 23, 2020, after consideration of Dr. Burbano's petition to terminate his suspension and MPRP's opinion that Dr. Burbano is safe to return to the practice of medicine, the Panel issued an Order Terminating Suspension and Imposing Probation¹ terminating the suspension imposed by the January 7, 2020 Order After Show Cause Hearing and ordered that Dr. Burbano be placed on probation for a minimum of four (4) years with terms and conditions.

Dr. Burbano has fully and satisfactorily complied with all of the terms and conditions of probation imposed by the October 23, 2020 Order Terminating Suspension and Imposing Probation, and four (4) years have passed.

It is thus, by the Panel, hereby
