CONSENT ORDER

On May 28, 2025, Disciplinary Panel A ("Panel A") of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the "Board") charged **Linda Myers, M.D.** (the "Respondent"), License Number **D64706**, under the Maryland Medical Practice Act (the "Act"), Md. Code Ann., Health Occupations ("Health Occ.") §§ 14-101 *et seq.* (2021 Repl. Vol. & 2024 Supp.).

Panel A charged the Respondent under the following provisions of Health Occ. § 14-404:

- (a) In general. Subject to the hearing provisions of § 14-405 of this subtitle, a disciplinary panel, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum of the disciplinary panel, may reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if a licensee:
 - (3) Is guilty of:
 - (ii) Unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine[.]

On August 13, 2025, Panel A was convened as a Disciplinary Committee for Case Resolution ("DCCR") in this matter. Based on negotiations occurring as a result of this DCCR, the Respondent agreed to enter into this Consent Order, consisting of Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order, and Consent.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Panel A finds:

I. Background

- 1. At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent was licensed to practice medicine in the State of Maryland. The Respondent was originally licensed to practice medicine in Maryland on June 12, 2006, under License Number D64706. The Respondent's license expires on September 30, 2025, subject to renewal.
 - 2. The Respondent holds medical licenses in Washington, D.C. and Virginia.
- 3. The Respondent is board-certified in Anesthesiology and lists General Practice as an area of practice.
- 4. At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent was employed as an anesthesiologist at a medical facility ("Facility 1")¹ located in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. Concurrently, the Respondent also worked at a medical spa ("Facility 2") located in Alexandria, Virginia., where she provided cosmetic treatments, including aesthetic injectables.

II. Board Investigation

5. The Board opened an investigation after receiving a complaint on October 17, 2024, from a co-worker of the Respondent ("Complainant"). The Complainant alleged that the Respondent had been bringing unused Botox from patients treated at Facility 2 and injecting it into staff at Facility 1 without documentation.

- 6. As part of its investigation, the Board obtained statements from the Complainant and reviewed documentation regarding the allegations. The Complainant stated that she observed the Respondent injecting staff with Botox that had been brought from Facility 2.
- 7. In a written response to the Board and during an investigative interview conducted on February 13, 2025, the Respondent acknowledged that she had administered Botox injections to at least three staff members within Facility 1. The Respondent stated that the Botox had been previously opened and used for patients at Facility 2 and that she transported the remaining product to Maryland to avoid waste. She admitted that the individuals who received the injections were not formal patients, that no medical records were created, and that no written informed consent was obtained. The Respondent indicated that the injections were performed informally and described them as favors to colleagues.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Disciplinary Panel A concludes as a matter of law that the Respondent is guilty of unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine, in violation of Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(3)(ii).

ORDER

It is thus, on the affirmative vote of the quorum of Disciplinary Panel A of the Board, hereby:

ORDERED that the Respondent is REPRIMANDED; and it is further

ORDERED that within ONE (1) YEAR of the effective date of this Consent Order, the Respondent shall pay a civil fine of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000.00). The Payment shall be by money order or bank certified check made payable to the Maryland Board of Physicians and mailed to P.O. Box 37217, Baltimore, Maryland 21297. The Board will not renew or reinstate the Respondent's license if the Respondent fails to timely pay the fine to the Board; and it is further

ORDERED that this Consent Order shall not be amended or modified, and future requests for modification will not be considered by the Board or a disciplinary panel; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent is responsible for all costs incurred in fulfilling the terms and conditions of this Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that, if the Respondent allegedly fails to comply with any term or condition imposed by this Consent Order, the Respondent shall be given notice and an opportunity for a hearing. If the disciplinary panel determines there is a genuine dispute as to a material fact, the hearing shall be before an Administrative Law Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings followed by an exceptions process before a disciplinary panel; and if the disciplinary panel determines there is no genuine dispute as to a material fact, the Respondent shall be given a show cause hearing before a disciplinary panel; and it is further

ORDERED that after the appropriate hearing, if the disciplinary panel determines that the Respondent has failed to comply with any term or condition imposed by this Consent Order, the disciplinary panel may reprimand the Respondent, place the

Respondent on probation with appropriate terms and conditions, suspend the Respondent's license with appropriate terms and conditions, or revoke the Respondent's license to practice medicine in Maryland. The disciplinary panel may, in addition to one or more of the sanctions set forth above, impose a civil monetary fine on the Respondent; and it is further

ORDERED that the effective date of the Consent Order is the date the Consent Order is signed by the Executive Director of the Board or her designee. The Executive Director or her designee signs the Consent Order on behalf of the disciplinary panel which has imposed the terms and conditions of this Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that this Consent Order is a public document. See Health Occ. §§ 1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2)(2021 Repl. Vol.) and Gen. Prov. § 4-333(b)(6)(2019 Repl. Vol.

I voluntarily enter into and agree to comply with the terms and conditions set forth in the Consent Order as a resolution of the charges. I waive any right to contest the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and Order set out in the Consent Order. I waive all rights to appeal this Consent Order.

I sign this Consent Order, without reservation, and fully understand the language and meaning of its terms.
