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**ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION**

On January 27, 2022, Disciplinary Panel A (the “Panel”) of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) issued an Order for Summary Suspension of License to Practice Medicine, wherein the Panel summarily suspended Eyako K. Wurapa, M.D.’s Maryland medical license. On February 10, 2022, the summary suspension was affirmed.

On March 29, 2022, the Panel and Dr. Wurapa entered into a Consent Order, wherein the Panel concluded, as a matter of law, that Dr. Wurapa was guilty of unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine, was professionally, physically, or mentally incompetent, was habitually intoxicated, provided professional services while under the influence of alcohol or while using a narcotic or controlled dangerous substance, and willfully made or filed a false report in the practice of medicine. The Consent Order reprimanded Dr. Wurapa, terminated the Order for Summary Suspension as moot, and suspended his license to practice medicine for a minimum period of one (1) year from the date of the Order for Summary Suspension with terms and conditions, including that he enroll in the Maryland Professional Rehabilitation Program (“MPRP”) and comply with all of MPRP’s referrals, rules, and requirements. The Consent Order further ordered that Dr. Wurapa may submit a written petition to the Panel to terminate the suspension after the minimum period of one (1) year and once MPRP determined and notified the Board that he was safe to return to the practice of

medicine.

On February 9, 2023, after consideration of Dr. Wurapa's petition to terminate his suspension, the Panel issued an Order Terminating Suspension and Imposing Probation,<sup>1</sup> wherein the Panel terminated the suspension imposed by the March 29, 2022 Consent Order and ordered that Dr. Wurapa be placed on probation for a minimum of eighteen (18) months with certain terms and conditions, including that he remained enrolled in MPRP.

Dr. Wurapa has fully and satisfactorily complied with all terms and conditions of the probation imposed by the Order Terminating Suspension and Imposing Probation, and eighteen (18) months have passed. It is thus hereby

**ORDERED** that the probation imposed by the February 9, 2023, Order Terminating Suspension and Imposing Probation is **TERMINATED**, and it is further

**ORDERED** that the Reprimand imposed by the March 29, 2022 Consent Order remains in effect, and it is further

**ORDERED** that this is a public document.
