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**ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION**

On January 15, 2019, Disciplinary Panel B (the “Panel”) of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) issued an Order for Summary Suspension of License to Practice Medicine, wherein the Panel summarily suspended Dr. Ouwinga’s Maryland medical license. On February 1, 2019, the summary suspension was affirmed.

On July 9, 2019, Dr. Ouwinga entered into a Consent Order with the Panel, wherein it was concluded, as a matter of law, that Dr. Ouwinga was guilty of unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine, was professionally, physically or mentally incompetent, and was addicted to, or habitually abuses any narcotic or controlled dangerous substance. The Consent Order terminated the Order for Summary Suspension, dated January 15, 2019, and suspended Dr. Ouwinga’s license with certain terms and conditions, including, that she enroll in the Maryland Professional Rehabilitation Program (“MPRP”). The Consent Order further ordered that Dr. Ouwinga may submit a written petition to the Panel to terminate the suspension once MPRP determined that she was safe to return to the practice of medicine.

On May 25, 2021, after consideration of Dr. Ouwinga’s petition to terminate her suspension, the Panel issued an Order Terminating Suspension and Imposing Probation,<sup>1</sup> wherein the Panel terminated the suspension imposed by the July 9, 2019 Consent Order and ordered Dr. Ouwinga be placed on probation for a minimum period of two (2) years, with certain terms and conditions, including, remaining

enrolled in MPRP and obtaining the Panel's approval for any practice setting at which Dr. Ouwinga intended to work as a physician.

Dr. Ouwinga has fully and satisfactorily complied with all of the terms and conditions of probation and two (2) years have passed. It is thus hereby

**ORDERED** that the probation and probationary terms and conditions imposed by the May 25, 2021 Order Terminating Suspension and Imposing Probation are **TERMINATED**; and it is further

**ORDERED** that this is a public document.
