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## **Introduction**

Panel A is summarily suspending the Respondent's license to practice medicine after a Board investigation revealed that he has a health condition that affects his ability to practice medicine safely.

## **Background/Licensing Information**

1. The Respondent was originally issued a license to practice medicine in Maryland on May 5, 2021, under License Number D91431. The Respondent's license expires on September 30, 2025, subject to renewal.

2. The Respondent is not board-certified.

3. At all relevant times, the Respondent was employed at a health care practice<sup>2</sup> in Connecticut (the "Connecticut Practice") until his employment was terminated on or around November 8, 2024. The Respondent is currently employed at a health care practice in Ellicott City, Maryland.

## **The Report**

4. On or about March 18, 2025, the Board received a letter from the Respondent (the "Report") stating, among other things, that the Connecticut Practice terminated his employment after he self-reported a "single off site sexual encounter with a woman [he] had previously seen on one occasion as a patient."

5. The Report further stated that the Respondent voluntarily surrendered his Connecticut medical license and was currently receiving treatment.

6. The Board conducted an investigation into the Report and determined, among other things, that the Respondent was unsafe to practice medicine.

### **The Board Investigation**

7. By letter dated March 31, 2025, and containing attachments, the Board notified the Respondent that, among other things, the Board has opened a full investigation based on the Report and requested that he authorize the release of his health records.

8. On or around March 31, 2025, the Respondent authorized the release of his health records to the Board.

9. Health records for the Respondent stated that between April 7-10, 2025, the Respondent was evaluated by a Program (the “Program”) and diagnosed with a health condition.<sup>3</sup>

10. The Program opined that the Respondent was presently “unfit” to practice medicine and recommended treatment.

11. On or around April 14, 2025, the Respondent voluntarily agreed to cease practicing medicine in Maryland.

12. On April 21, 2025, the Respondent began receiving treatment for his health condition at a treatment center (the “Treatment Center”).

13. On May 22, 2025, the Respondent discharged from the Treatment Center without completing the recommended treatment and against medical advice.

14. At the time of discharge, a professional employed at the Treatment Center opined that the Respondent's prognosis was "poor" and that he was not safe to practice medicine.

### **CONCLUSION OF LAW**

Based upon the foregoing Investigative Findings, Panel A of the Board concludes that the public health, safety, or welfare imperatively requires emergency action, and that pursuant to State Gov't § 10-226(c)(2) and COMAR 10.32.02.08B(7), the Respondent's license is summarily suspended.

### **ORDER**

**IT IS** thus, by Panel A of the Board, hereby:

**ORDERED** that pursuant to the authority vested in Panel A by State Govt. § 10-226(c)(2)(2021 Repl. Vol. and 2024 Supp.) and COMAR 10.32.02.08B(7), the Respondent's license to practice medicine in the State of Maryland is hereby **SUMMARILY SUSPENDED**; and it is further

**ORDERED** that, during the course of the summary suspension, the Respondent shall not practice medicine in the State of Maryland; and it is further

**ORDERED** that in accordance with Md. Code Regs. 10.32.02.08B(7) and E, a post-deprivation hearing on the summary suspension will be held on **Wednesday, July 9, 2025, at 10:15 a.m.** at the Board's offices, located at 4201 Patterson Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland, 21215-0095; and it is further



**ORDERED** that after the **SUMMARY SUSPENSION** hearing before Panel A, the Respondent, if dissatisfied with the result of the hearing, may request, within ten (10) days, an evidentiary hearing, such hearing to be set within thirty (30) days of the request, before an Administrative Law Judge at the Office of Administrative Hearings, Administrative Law Building, 11101 Gilroy Road, Hunt Valley, Maryland 21031-1301; and it is further

**ORDERED** that a copy of the Order for Summary Suspension shall be filed by Panel A immediately in accordance with Health Occ. § 14-407 (2021 Repl. Vol. and 2024 Supp.); and it is further

**ORDERED** that this is a disciplinary Order of Panel A, and as such, is a public document. *See* Health Occ. §§ 1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Md. Code Ann., Gen. Prov. § 4-333(b)(6).
