CONSENT ORDER

In or around January and February of 2024, the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) sent multiple correspondence to **COLLIN M. HERMAN, M.D.**, License Number D99064 (the “Respondent”), notifying him of his failure to complete the supplemental application under the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact and his obligation to do so. Having received no response from the Respondent, Disciplinary Panel B of the Board (“Panel B”) determined that it has grounds to charge the Respondent with failing to comply with provisions of the Maryland Medical Practice Act (the “Act”), Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. (“Health Occ.”) §§ 14-101 *et seq.* (2021 Repl. Vol. & 2023 Supp.).

The pertinent provisions of the Act are as follows:

Health Occ. § 14-404. Denials, reprimands, probations, suspensions, and revocations – Grounds,

(a) *In general* – Subject to the hearing provisions of § 14-405 of this subtitle, a disciplinary panel, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum of the disciplinary panel, may reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the licensee:

.....

(43) Except for the licensure process described under Subtitle 3A of this title, violates any provision of this title, any rule or

regulation adopted by the Board, or any State or federal law pertaining to the practice of medicine.

Health Occ. § 14-313.1. Verification by compact physician regarding licensure

- (a) *In general.* -- Within 30 days after receiving a request from the Board, a compact physician shall provide to the Board verification, on a form provided by the Board, that the compact physician satisfied the requirements for licensure under this subtitle.

Prior to the issuance of disciplinary charges, the Respondent agreed to enter into this Consent Order, consisting of Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order, and Consent.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Panel B finds the following facts:

1. At all times relevant, the Respondent was and is licensed to practice medicine in the State of Maryland. The Respondent initially was licensed to practice medicine in Maryland under the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact on November 28, 2023, under License Number D99064. The Respondent's license is current through September 30, 2024.
2. At all times relevant, the Respondent was licensed to practice medicine in the State of Ohio. The Respondent initially was licensed by the State Board of Medical of Ohio on April 27, 2023, under License Number 35.148124. The Respondent's Ohio medical license is current through April 27, 2025.
3. By emails dated December 1, 2023, December 6, 2023, and December 13, 2023, sent to the email address the Respondent provided in his application for licensure for

Board notifications, the Board requested that the Respondent complete the Board's online Supplemental Questions and Practitioner Profile. The Respondent failed to complete the Supplemental Questions and Practitioner Profile within 30 days of the Board's request.

4. By letter dated January 9, 2024, sent to the email address and physical address the Respondent provided in his application for licensure for Board notifications, the Board again notified the Respondent of his failure and obligation to complete the Supplemental Questions and Practitioner Profile. The Board's letter further notified the Respondent that it had opened a preliminary investigation and his failure to complete the supplement application may result in disciplinary action against him. In addition to email, the Board's January 9, 2024 letter was sent to the Respondent by United States Postal Service First-Class Mail and was not returned as undeliverable.

5. On February 6, 2024, Board staff called the telephone number the Respondent provided in his application for licensure and left a voicemail reminding the Respondent of his obligation to complete the Supplemental Questions and Practitioner Profile.

6. By email dated February 15, 2024, to the Respondent's email address of record with the Board, Board staff attached the Board's January 9, 2024 letter and requested that the Respondent complete the Supplemental Questions and Practitioner Profile by February 20, 2024.

7. The Respondent failed to complete the Supplemental Questions and Practitioner Profile other otherwise respond to the Board by February 20, 2024, or any time thereafter.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, Panel B concludes as a matter of law that the Respondent's failure to complete the Board's Supplemental Questions and Practitioner Profile within thirty (30) days after being requested to do so by the Board constitutes violating any provision of this title, any rule or regulation adopted by the Board, or any State or federal law pertaining to the practice of medicine, *i.e.* Health Occ. § 14-313.1(a), in violation of Health Occ § 14-404(a)(43).

ORDER

It is, on the affirmative vote of a majority of Panel B, hereby:

ORDERED that the Respondent be and hereby is **REPRIMANDED**; and it is further

ORDERED that, **within 6 months** from the effective date of this Consent Order, the Respondent shall pay a civil fine of **FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500)**. The payment shall be by bank certified check or money order made payable to the Maryland Board of Physicians, P.O. Box 37217, Baltimore, Maryland 21297. The Board will not renew or reinstate the Respondent's license if the Respondent fails to pay the fine; and it is further

ORDERED that the effective date of the Consent Order is the date the Consent Order is signed by the Executive Director of the Board or her designee. The Executive Director or her designee signs the Consent Order on behalf of the disciplinary panel which has imposed the terms and conditions of this Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that this Consent Order is a public document. *See* Health Occ. §§ 1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Gen. Prov. § 4-333(b)(6) (2021 Repl. Vol.).

I voluntarily enter into and agree to comply with the terms and conditions set forth in this Consent Order as a resolution of the pending disciplinary matters. I waive any right to contest the Findings of Fact and the Conclusions of Law set out in this Consent Order. I

waive all right to appeal this Consent Order.

I sign this Consent Order without reservation, and I fully understand and comprehend the language and meaning of its terms.
