

The Maryland Board has determined that the acts for which the Respondent was disciplined in Wisconsin would be grounds for disciplinary action under H.O. § 14-404(a). The grounds for disciplinary action under H.O. § 14-404(a) are as follows:

- (22) Fails to meet appropriate standards as determined by appropriate peer review for the delivery of quality medical and surgical care performed in an outpatient facility, office, hospital, or any other location in this State.

Based on the action taken by the Wisconsin Board, the Respondent agrees to enter into this Consent Order with the Maryland Board of Physicians, consisting of Procedural Background, Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order of reciprocal action.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds the following:

1. At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent was a physician licensed to practice Diagnostic Radiology in the State of Maryland. The Respondent was initially licensed in Maryland on or about March 30, 1992.
2. By Order dated December 21, 2016, the Wisconsin Board disciplined the Respondent by reprimand based upon her interpretation of a patient's CT scan wherein the Respondent failed to identify a destructive mass and recommend a biopsy to diagnose or exclude the presence of cancer.

A copy of the Wisconsin Order is attached hereto.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Maryland Board concludes as a matter of law that the disciplinary action taken by the Wisconsin Board against the Respondent was for an act or acts that would be grounds for disciplinary action under Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(22) had those offenses been committed in this state.

III. ORDER

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is hereby:

ORDERED that the Respondent be and is hereby **REPRIMANDED**; and be it further



The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Medical Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Ann A. Tran, M.D. (DOB May 29, 1958), is licensed in the state of Wisconsin to practice medicine and surgery, having license number 47923-20, first issued on March 16, 2005, with registration current through October 31, 2017. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is Virtual Radiologic, 11995 Singletree Lane, Suite 500, Eden Prairie, Minnesota 55344.

2. Respondent is board certified in diagnostic radiology, and practices teleradiology.

3. In February 2009, in Massachusetts, Patient A presented to his primary care physician with complaints of prolonged chest pain. The provider ordered a CT scan of Patient A's chest, which was interpreted by another radiologist on March 5, 2009, as showing interstitial disease.

4. Patient A was referred for a high resolution CT scan of his chest, which was remotely interpreted by James H. Turner, III, M.D., on March 19, 2009, also as showing interstitial lung disease.¹

5. Patient A returned to his physician in August 2009 with complaints of an apparent mass in his chest. He was examined by a nurse, who charted her observation of "a large mass in the middle of [Patient A's] chest."

6. On August 24, 2009, Respondent remotely interpreted a CT scan of Patient A's thorax. Respondent was also provided with the March 5 and March 19, 2009 studies, and a clinical history of "CT Chest Mass in Mid Chest." Respondent's report does not reference the mass in Patient A's sternum and states her impression as:

Old granulomatous disease and chronic interstitial lung disease. Nodular pleural thickening right middle lobe. Stable findings compared to earlier examination.

7. In January 2010, Patient A presented to his physician with ongoing concerns about the growing mass in his chest, and was diagnosed with a solitary plasmacytoma of the sternum.

8. After undergoing radiation treatment, Patient A died on April 25, 2010.

9. In the course of investigating this matter, the March 5, March 19 and August 24, 2009 CT studies were reviewed by a board certified radiologist, who indicated that in all three studies a destructive mass was clearly visible. Respondent should have made these findings on August 24, 2009, and recommended biopsy to diagnose or exclude the presence of cancer.

10. On November 16, 2016, Respondent successfully completed ten AMA/PRA Category 1 continuing medical education credits on the topic of Emergency Radiology.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent Ann A. Tran, M.D., engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § Med 10.02(2)(h) (Nov. 2002) by engaging in conduct which tends to constitute a danger to the health, welfare, or safety of a patient.

¹ Dr. Turner was a co-respondent in this matter and stipulated to a final decision and order entered by the Board on October 19, 2016; the radiologist who interpreted the March 5, 2009 CT study is not licensed in Wisconsin.

3. As a result of the above conduct, Ann A. Tran, M.D., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3).

ORDER


1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
2. Respondent Ann A. Tran, M.D., is REPRIMANDED.
3. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board accepts the education described in the Findings of Fact as satisfying the education it would have otherwise ordered.
4. Within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, Ann A. Tran, M.D., shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$690.00.
5. Proof of successful course completion and payment of costs (made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services) shall be sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:



The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event Respondent fails to timely submit payment of costs as ordered, Respondent's license (no. 47923-20) may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with payment of costs.

7. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.

Respondent Ann Anh Tran, M.D., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.

2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:

- the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
- the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
- the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
- the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
- the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
- the right to petition for rehearing; and
- all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.

3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation. Respondent is represented by Attorney James Friedman.


4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.

5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.



Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.

7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.


8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
