ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

On April 9, 2009, the Oregon Medical Board suspended the medical license of Mark Baskerville, M.D. On June 12, 2009, based upon the order in Oregon, the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the "Maryland Board") and Dr. Baskerville entered into a Consent Order that suspended Dr. Baskerville's license to practice medicine in Maryland until the Oregon Medical Board activated his license, at which point he would be placed on probation.¹ Dr. Baskerville was also reprimanded. The Consent Order was based upon § 14-404(a)(21) of the Health Occupations Article, which authorizes the Maryland Board to discipline a licensee if the licensee is disciplined by another licensing or disciplinary authority for an act that would be grounds under § 14-404 of the Health Occupations Article. The underlying grounds were § 14-404(a)(3)(ii) and § 14-404(a)(8).

On May 6, 2011, Dr. Baskerville's license with the Oregon Medical Board became active. Accordingly, on December 9, 2011, the Maryland Board issued an Order in which Dr. Baskerville was placed on probation for five years with terms and conditions.² Dr. Baskerville has satisfied the terms of the December 9, 2011, order. Thus, it is hereby

ORDERED that the **PROBATION** imposed by the December 9, 2011, Order is **TERMINATED**; and it is further


