CONSENT ORDER

BACKGROUND

The Maryland Board of Physicians (the "Maryland Board") received information that Muhammad Farooq, M.D., (the "Respondent"), License Number: D65608, was disciplined by the Delaware Board of Medical Licensure and Discipline (the "Delaware Board"). In an Order dated September 18, 2018, the Delaware Board disciplined the Respondent by reprimand with terms and conditions.

Based on the above referenced Delaware Board sanction, the Maryland Board has grounds to charge the Respondent with violating the following provisions of the Maryland Medical Practice Act (the "Act"), under H. O. § 14-404(a):

- (a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 14-405 of this subtitle, a disciplinary panel, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum of the disciplinary panel, may reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the licensee:
 - (21) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country or disciplined by any branch of the United States uniformed services or the Veteran's Administration for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under this section,

The Maryland Board has determined that the acts for which the Respondent was disciplined in Delaware would be grounds for disciplinary action under H.O. § 14-404(a). The grounds for disciplinary action under H.O. § 14-404(a) are as follows:

- (3ii) Unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine;
- (11) Willfully makes or files a false report or record in the practice of medicine;
- (40) Fails to keep adequate medical records as determined by appropriate peer review;

Based on the action taken by the Delaware Board, the Respondent agrees to enter into this Consent Order with the Maryland Board of Physicians, consisting of Procedural Background, Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order of reciprocal action.

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board finds the following:

- 1. At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent was a physician licensed to practice medicine in the State of Maryland. The Respondent was initially licensed in Maryland on or about February 6, 2007.
- 2. By Order dated September 18, 2018, the Delaware Board disciplined the Respondent by reprimand with terms and conditions.
- 3. The Delaware Board found that the Respondent issued and documented that he saw a patient on May 17, 2017; reviewed UDS results, documented a final written warning to the patient and electronically signed a prescription for Suboxone for the patient; however, the Delaware Board found that the Respondent was not working at that location on the date he wrote the prescription, and did not physically examine or have contact with the patient.

A copy of the Delaware Order is attached hereto.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Maryland Board concludes as a matter of law that the disciplinary action taken by the Delaware Board against the Respondent was for an act or acts that would be grounds for disciplinary action under Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(3ii),(11), and (40) had those offenses been committed in this state.

III. <u>ORDER</u>

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is hereby:

ORDERED that the Respondent is hereby REPRIMANDED, and subject to the following terms and conditions:

- a. The Respondent shall remain in compliance with the terms and conditions of the September 18, 2018 Delaware Board Order;
- b. The Maryland Order shall remain in effect until the Respondent has satisfied the terms and conditions of the Delaware Board Order of September 18, 2018 and provides proof of termination of the Order;
- c. If the Respondent fails to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Order, that failure may constitute a violation of the Order and, after notice and hearing, the Maryland Board or a Board panel, may suspend or revoke the Respondent's license; and be it further;

ORDERED that this **CONSENT ORDER** is a **PUBLIC DOCUMENT** pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Gen. Prov. §§4-101 through 4-601 (2014).
