Dear Dr. Wurapa and Counsel:

On January 27, 2022, Disciplinary Panel A of the Maryland State Board of Physicians issued an ORDER FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION OF LICENSE TO PRACTICE MEDICINE in this case, pursuant to Md. Code Ann., State Gov't § 10-226(c)(2). On February 9, 2022, Dr. Wurapa was given an opportunity to attend a post-deprivation hearing before Disciplinary Panel A to show cause why that suspension should not be continued. Dr. Wurapa attended the hearing on that date and was represented by counsel, Carolyn Jacobs, Esquire. The State was represented by Karen Malinowski, Assistant Attorney General, Administrative Prosecutor. Both parties presented oral arguments at the post-deprivation hearing.

After consideration of the parties' presentations, Disciplinary Panel A determined, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the health, safety, and welfare of the public imperatively required the disciplinary panel to summarily suspend Dr. Wurapa's license and there exists a substantial risk of serious harm to the public health, safety, and welfare in Dr. Wurapa's continued practice. Disciplinary Panel A thus will not lift the summary suspension order, and the summary suspension imposed on January 27, 2022 is reaffirmed and continues in effect. See COMAR 10.32.02.08H(1).

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NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL

Under the Board regulations, Dr. Wurapa has the right to request a full evidentiary hearing before an Administrative Law Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings. This request will be granted if the Board receives a written request for the hearing within TEN (10) days of the date of this letter. Any request for a hearing should be sent to Christine A. Farrelly, Executive Director, Maryland Board of Physicians, 4201 Patterson Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland 21215. If Dr. Wurapa requests such a hearing, the regulations require that an Administrative Law Judge set the hearing to begin within 30 days of the request, see COMAR 10.32.02.08I, though Dr. Wurapa may waive that 30-day requirement.

This letter constitutes an order of the Board through Disciplinary Panel A resulting from formal disciplinary action and is therefore a public document.
