CONSENT ORDER

PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

The Maryland Board of Physicians (the "Maryland Board") received information that Aharon Wolf, M.D., (the "Respondent") License Number D85679, was disciplined by the North Carolina Medical Board (the "North Carolina Board"). By Consent Order dated February 27, 2021, the Respondent was reprimanded by the North Carolina Board.

Based on the above referenced North Carolina sanction, the Maryland Board has grounds to charge the Respondent with violating the following provisions of the Maryland Medical Practice Act (the "Act"), under H. O. § 14-404(a):

- (a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 14-405 of this subtitle, a disciplinary panel, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum of the disciplinary panel, may reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the licensee:
 - (21) Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority or convicted or disciplined by a court of any state or country or disciplined by any branch of the United States uniformed services or the Veteran's Administration for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under this section,

Disciplinary Panel B ("Panel B") has determined that the acts for which the Respondent was disciplined in North Carolina would be grounds for disciplinary action under H.O. § 14-404(a). The grounds for disciplinary action under H.O. § 14-404(a) are as follows:

- (1) Fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to obtain a license for the applicant or licensee or for another;
- (3) Is guilty of:
 - (ii) Unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine;
- (36) Willfully makes a false representation when seeking or making application for licensure or any other application related to the practice of medicine;

Based on the action taken by the North Carolina Board, the Respondent agrees to enter into this Consent Order with Panel B, consisting of Procedural Background, Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order and Consent.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Panel B makes the following findings of fact:

1. At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent was a physician licensed to practice medicine in the State of Maryland. The Respondent was initially licensed in Maryland on or about June 7, 2018.

2. On July 2, 2019 (effective August 1, 2019), the Medical Board of California (the "California Board") issued a Decision denying the Respondent's application for a California physician's and surgeon's certificate based upon the Respondent's omission of material information in his application related to his academic history, including a formal academic warning, academic probation, and resignation from a residency program.

3. By Consent Agreement and Order dated July 29, 2020, the Pennsylvania Board of Medicine (the "Pennsylvania Board") issued a public reprimand based upon the California Board Decision.

4. By Final Order dated August 13, 2020, the Florida Board of Medicine (the "Florida Board") issued a Letter of Concern against the Respondent's license with terms and

conditions and imposed an administrative fine based upon the California Board's denial of the Respondent's application.

5. On February 27, 2021, the North Carolina Medical Board (the "North Carolina Board") issued its Consent Order reprimanding the Respondent based upon the actions of the California and Pennsylvania Boards.

A copy of the North Carolina Board Order is attached hereto.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, Panel B concludes as a matter of law that the Respondent is subject to discipline under Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(21) for the disciplinary action taken by the North Carolina Board against the Respondent for an act or acts that would be grounds for disciplinary action under Health Occ. §14-404(a)(1), (3)(ii), and (36).

ORDER

It is, thus, by Panel B, hereby:

ORDERED that the Respondent be and is hereby **REPRIMANDED**; and is hereby ; and it is further

ORDERED that this Consent Order is a public document. *See* Health Occ. §§1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Gen. Prov. §4-333(b)(6).

I voluntarily enter into and agree to comply with the terms and conditions set forth in the Consent Order as a resolution of the charges. I waive any right to contest the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and Order set out in the Consent Order. I waive all rights to appeal this Consent Order.

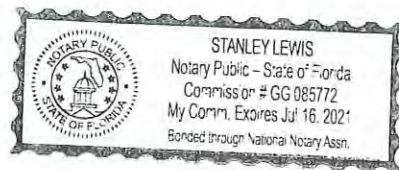

This matter is before the North Carolina Medical Board ("Board") regarding information provided to the Board concerning Aharon Aviv Wolf, M.D. ("Dr. Wolf"). Dr. Wolf makes the following admissions, and the Board makes the following findings and conclusions:

STATUTORY AUTHORITY

The Board is a body duly organized under the laws of North Carolina and is the proper party to bring this proceeding under the authority granted to it in Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the North Carolina General Statutes and the rules and regulations promulgated thereto.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Dr. Wolf was first issued a license to practice medicine by the Board on or about June 7, 2018, license number 2018-01476.

At all times relevant hereto, Dr. Wolf practiced Occupational and Environmental Medicine in Florida. Dr. Wolf holds active licenses to practice medicine in several states including, but not limited to, Florida, North Carolina, and Pennsylvania.

On June 3, 2019, the Medical Board of California ("California Board") entered a Proposed Decision to deny Dr. Wolf's application for a California physician's and surgeon's certificate. The Proposed Decision was based on Dr. Wolf's omission of material information in his application related to his academic history, including a formal academic warning, academic probation, and resignation from a residency program. On July 2, 2019, the California Board adopted the Proposed Decision effective August 1, 2019.

On June 18, 2020, the Pennsylvania State Board of Medicine ("Pennsylvania Board") and Dr. Wolf entered into a Consent Agreement and Order in which Dr. Wolf was publicly reprimanded based on the California Board denying Dr. Wolf's application for a California physician's and surgeon's certificate. The Pennsylvania Board approved and adopted the Consent Agreement by an Order dated July 29, 2020.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Dr. Wolf acknowledges that his conduct, as described above, constitutes Dr. Wolf's license to practice medicine being restricted or acted against by the licensing authority of any jurisdiction within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(13) which is grounds under that section of the North Carolina General Statutes for the Board to annul, suspend, revoke, condition, or

limit Dr. Wolf's license to practice medicine or to deny any application he may make in the future.

PROCEDURAL STIPULATIONS

Dr. Wolf acknowledges and agrees that the Board has jurisdiction over him and over the subject matter of this case.

Dr. Wolf knowingly waives his right to any hearing and to any judicial review or appeal in this case.

Dr. Wolf acknowledges that he has read and understands this Consent Order and enters into it voluntarily.

Dr. Wolf desires to resolve this matter without the need for more formal proceedings.

The Board has determined that it is in the public interest to resolve this case as set forth below.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, with Dr. Wolf's consent, it is ORDERED that:

1. Dr. Wolf is hereby REPRIMANDED.
2. Dr. Wolf shall obey all laws. Likewise, he shall obey all rules and regulations involving the practice of medicine.
3. Dr. Wolf shall meet with the Board or members of the Board for an investigative interview at such times as requested by the Board.
4. Upon request, Dr. Wolf shall provide the Board with any information the Board deems necessary to verify compliance with the terms and conditions of this Consent Order.

5. If Dr. Wolf fails to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Order, that failure shall constitute unprofessional conduct within the meaning of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-14(a)(6) and shall be grounds, after any required notice and hearing, for the Board to annul, suspend, or revoke his license to practice medicine and to deny any application he might make in the future or then have pending for a license to practice medicine.

6. This Consent Order shall take effect immediately upon its execution by both Dr. Wolf and the Board, and it shall continue in effect until specifically ordered otherwise by the Board.


7. Dr. Wolf hereby waives any requirement under any law or rule that this Consent Order be served on him.

8. Upon execution by Dr. Wolf and the Board, this Consent Order shall become a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the North Carolina General Statutes and shall be subject to public inspection and dissemination pursuant to the provisions thereof. Additionally, it will be reported to persons, entities, agencies, and clearinghouses as required and permitted by law including, but not limited to, the Federation of State Medical Boards and the National Practitioner Data Bank.

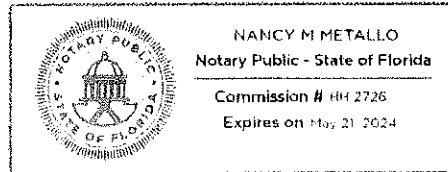
