CONSENT ORDER

In or around April 2023, the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”) initiated an investigation of **YOGESH VOHRA, M.D.**, License Number D63199, after discovering that he was the supervising physician of a physician assistant (the “Physician Assistant”),¹ who was practicing as a physician assistant in Maryland without a Board-approved delegation agreement. At the conclusion of its investigation, Panel A determined that it has grounds to charge the Respondent with failing to comply with provisions of the Maryland Medical Practice Act (the “Act”), Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. (“Health Occ.”) §§ 14-101 *et seq.* (2021 Repl. Vol. & 2023 Supp.).

The pertinent provisions of the Act are as follows:

Health Occ. § 14-404. Denials, reprimands, probations, suspensions, and revocations – Grounds,

- (a) *In general* – Subject to the hearing provisions of § 14-405 of this subtitle, a disciplinary panel, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum of the disciplinary panel, may reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the licensee:

- (43) Except for the licensure process described under Subtitle 3A of this title, violates any provision of this title, any rule or regulation adopted by the Board, or any State or federal law pertaining to the practice of medicine.

The pertinent provision under Health Occ. § 14-404(a)(43) provides:

Health Occ. § 15-302. Delegation Agreements.

- (a) A physician may delegate medical acts to a physician assistant only after:
- (1) A delegation agreement has been executed and filed with the Board[.]

Prior to the issuance of disciplinary charges, the Respondent agreed to enter into this Consent Order, consisting of Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order, and Consent.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Panel A finds the following facts:

1. At all times relevant, the Respondent was and is licensed to practice medicine in the State of Maryland. The Respondent initially was licensed to practice medicine in Maryland on May 17, 2005, under License Number D63199. The Respondent's license expires on September 30, 2025, subject to renewal.
2. The Respondent is board-certified in Internal Medicine.
3. At all times relevant, the Respondent practiced medicine as an independent contractor at a health care facility (the "Facility") located in Salisbury, Maryland, with the Physician Assistant.

4. By letter dated June 6, 2023, the Facility notified the Board of an “oversight that occurred within our organization regarding the filing of a supervising physician delegation agreement for [the Physician Assistant].” The Facility stated that it had corrected the mistake and completed the delegation agreement.

5. Based on the Facility’s June 6, 2023, letter, the Board initiated an investigation of the matter.

6. The Board’s investigation revealed that the Physician Assistant began working at the Facility on September 29, 2021, and treated patients under the Respondent’s supervision until April 27, 2023, without a Board approved delegation agreement.

7. On or about April 27, 2023, the Physician Assistant and the Respondent filed the required delegation agreement with the Board, which the Board approved on April 28, 2023.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, Panel A concludes as a matter of law that the Respondent delegated medical acts to the Physician Assistant from September 29, 2021, to April 27, 2023, without a delegation agreement having been executed and filed with the Board, which constitutes a violation of Health Occ. § 15-302(a)(1) and § 14-404(a)(43).

ORDER

It is, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum of Panel A, hereby:

ORDERED that the Respondent be and hereby is **REPRIMANDED**; and it is further

ORDERED that, **within 6 months** from the effective date of this Consent Order, the Respondent shall pay a civil fine of **ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000)**. The payment shall be by bank certified check or money order made payable to the Maryland Board of Physicians, P.O. Box 37217, Baltimore, Maryland 21297. The Board will not renew or reinstate the Respondent's license if the Respondent fails to pay the fine; and it is further

ORDERED that the effective date of the Consent Order is the date the Consent Order is signed by the Executive Director of the Board or her designee. The Executive Director or her designee signs the Consent Order on behalf of the disciplinary panel which has imposed the terms and conditions of this Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that this Consent Order is a public document. *See* Health Occ. §§ 1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Gen. Prov. § 4-333(b)(6) (2021 Repl. Vol.).

I waive any right to contest the Findings of Fact and the Conclusions of Law set out in this Consent Order. I waive all right to appeal this Consent Order.

I sign this Consent Order without reservation, and I fully understand and

comprehend the language and meaning of its terms.
