**ORDER**

On November 30, 2015, the Virginia Board of Medicine (the "Virginia Board") disciplined Mudit Sharma, M.D. by issuing a reprimand and requiring that he comply with certain terms and conditions. On January 29, 2016, based upon the order in Virginia, Dr. Sharma and the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the "Maryland Board") entered into a Consent Order in which the Maryland Board reprimanded Dr. Sharma and required him to comply with the terms and conditions imposed by the Virginia Board.<sup>1</sup> On March 21, 2016, the Virginia Board issued a public letter terminating the terms and conditions of the November 30, 2015 order based on Dr. Sharma's compliance. Thus, it is hereby

**ORDERED** that the terms and conditions of the January 29, 2016 Consent Order are hereby **TERMINATED**; and is further

**ORDERED** that the reprimand shall remain in effect; and it is further

**ORDERED** that this Order is a **PUBLIC DOCUMENT** pursuant to Md. Code Ann., General Prov. §§ 4-101 *et seq.* (2014).
