Dear Colleague:

Thank you for your continued efforts to decrease infant and toddler RSV infections through the administration of monoclonal antibodies (Beyfortus™ and ENFLONSIA™) as well as maternal vaccine (Abrysvo). Increasingly, studies are showing the importance of using these immunizations to decrease morbidity and mortality from RSV infection.

We write to inform you that due to the continued RSV activity in Maryland, we are recommending that providers continue to administer monoclonal antibodies through April 30, 2026.

Vaccines for Children (VFC) enrolled providers will be able to order RSV monoclonal antibodies every Thursday through April for their VFC-eligible patients. Privately purchased inventory must be used for their non VFC-eligible patients.
