Recruitment for Committee Vacancy

Dear Physicians:

The Maryland Board of Physicians (the Board) is looking to fill a vacant physician position on the Physician Assistant Advisory Committee (the PAAC). Successful candidates must:

- Be a Maryland resident and hold an active and unencumbered Maryland license;
- Specialize in general surgery or a surgical subspecialty; and
- Has previously served or currently serves as supervising physician of a physician assistant under a Board-approved delegation agreement.

The PAAC consists of three licensed physician assistants, three licensed physicians (at least one of whom specializes in general surgery or a surgical subspecialty, and at least one of whom specializes in internal medicine, family practice, or a similar primary care specialty), and one consumer member. Of the three physician members, two shall be previously or currently serving as supervising physicians of a physician assistant under a Board-approved delegation agreement.

The PAAC advises the Board on matters relating to the practice of physician assistants. The Committee's duties are described in <u>Health Occupations Article</u>, §15-205(a), Annotated Code of Maryland.

Meetings are virtual and held on the first Wednesday of every month, beginning at 4:00 p.m. However, there may be occasions when meetings will be held at the Board's office in the Metro Executive Building, 4201 Patterson Avenue, Baltimore. Attendance is essential.

PAAC members serve staggered three-year terms. Members may be reappointed for a second term; however, an individual may not serve more than two consecutive three-year terms.

Note: A candidate appointed to the PAAC may not serve concurrently on the Advisory Committee and as an elected officer in their professional association. (<u>Health Occupations Article §1-222(b)</u>, Annotated Code of Maryland.)
