Dear Physicians:

The Maryland Board of Physicians (the Board) is looking to fill a vacant physician position on the Polysomnography Professional Standards Committee (the PPSC). Successful candidates must:

- Be a licensed physician who is board certified in sleep medicine; and
- Be a specialist in neurology.

The PPSC consists of three licensed polysomnographic technologists, three licensed physicians who are board certified in sleep medicine (one of whom is a specialist in psychiatry or internal medicine, one of whom is a specialist in pulmonary medicine, one of whom is a specialist in neurology), and one consumer member.

The PPSC advises the Board on matters relating to the practice of polysomnography. The PPSC's duties are described in <u>Health Occupations Article</u>, <u>§14-5C-07(a)</u>, Annotated Code of Maryland.

Meetings are virtual and held on the fourth Thursday in February and August, beginning at 4:00 p.m. However, there may be occasions when meetings will be held at the Board's office in the Metro Executive Building, 4201 Patterson Avenue, Baltimore. Attendance is essential.

PPSC members serve staggered three-year terms. Members may be reappointed for a second term; however, an individual may not serve more than two consecutive three-year terms.

Note: A candidate appointed to the Committee may not serve concurrently on the Advisory Committee and as an elected officer in their professional association. (<u>Health Occupations</u> Article §1-222(b), Annotated Code of Maryland.)
