Recruitment for Committee Vacancy

Dear Physicians:

The Maryland Board of Physicians (the Board) is looking to fill a physician vacancy on the Radiation Therapy, Radiography, Nuclear Medicine Technology, and Radiology Assistance Advisory Committee (the Rad Tech Committee).

The Board is recruiting for a physician who specializes in nuclear medicine. Successful candidates must be licensed in Maryland and have an unencumbered license.

The Rad Tech Committee consists of one licensed radiation therapist, one licensed radiographer, one licensed radiologist assistant, one licensed nuclear medicine technologist, four licensed physicians (one of whom specializes in radiology, one of whom specializes in radiology and supervises a radiologist assistant, one of whom specializes in nuclear medicine, and one of whom specializes in radiation oncology), and one consumer member.

The Rad Tech Committee advises the Board on matters relating to radiation therapy, radiology, nuclear medicine technology, and radiology assistance. The Committee's duties are described in Health Occupations Article, 14-5B-06(a), Annotated Code of Maryland.

Meetings are virtual and held at 4:00 p.m. on the third Wednesday in March, July, and November. However, there may be occasions when meetings will be held at the Board's office in the Metro Executive Building, 4201 Patterson Avenue, Baltimore. Attendance is essential.

Rad Tech Committee members serve staggered three-year terms. Members may be reappointed for a second term; however, an individual may not serve more than two consecutive three-year terms.

Note: A candidate appointed to the Committee may not serve concurrently on the Advisory Committee and as an elected officer in their professional association. (<u>Health Occupations Article §1-222(b)</u>, Annotated Code of Maryland.)
