

Recruitment for Committee Vacancy

Dear Physicians:

The Maryland Board of Physicians (the Board) is looking to fill a vacant physician position on the Polysomnography Advisory Committee (the Committee). Successful candidates must:

- Be a licensed physician who is board-certified in sleep medicine;
- Be a specialist in psychiatry or internal medicine; and
- Be a Maryland resident.

The Committee consists of three licensed polysomnographic technologists, three licensed physicians who are board-certified in sleep medicine (one of whom is a specialist in psychiatry or internal medicine, one in pulmonary medicine, and one in neurology), and one consumer member.

The role of the Committee is to advise the Board on matters relating to the practice of polysomnography. The duties of the Committee are found in [Health Occupations Article, §14-5C-07](#), Annotated Code of Maryland.

Meetings are virtual and held on the fourth Thursday in February and August, beginning at 4:00 p.m. However, there may be occasions when meetings are held at the Board's office in the Metro Executive Building, 4201 Patterson Avenue, Baltimore. Attendance is essential.

Committee members serve staggered three-year terms. Members may be reappointed for a second term; however, an individual may not serve more than two consecutive three-year terms.

A candidate appointed to the Committee may not serve concurrently as a member of the Advisory Committee and as an elected officer in their professional association. ([Health Occupations Article §1-222\(b\)](#), Annotated Code of Maryland.)

Candidates must also complete and submit a Biographical Information Form, an Appointee Exemption Disclosure Form, and a Candidate Questionnaire, which will be provided later in the application process.
