

Recruitment for Committee Vacancy

Dear Radiologist Assistants:

The Maryland Board of Physicians (the Board) is looking to fill a radiologist assistant vacancy on the Radiation Therapy, Radiography, Nuclear Medicine Technology, and Radiology Assistance Advisory Committee (Rad Tech Committee). Successful candidates must:

- Hold an active, unencumbered Maryland license; and
- Be a Maryland resident.

The Rad Tech Committee consists of one licensed radiation therapist, one licensed radiographer, one licensed radiologist assistant, one licensed nuclear medicine technologist, four licensed physicians (one of whom specializes in radiology, one specializes in radiology and supervises a radiologist assistant, one of whom specializes in nuclear medicine, and one of whom specializes in radiation oncology), and one consumer member.

The role of the Rad Tech Committee is to advise the Board on matters relating to the practice of radiation therapy, radiography, nuclear medicine technology, and radiology assistance. The duties of the Rad Tech Committee can be found in [Health Occupations Article, §14-5B-06](#), Annotated Code of Maryland.

Meetings are held virtually on the third Wednesday of March, July, and November, starting at 4:00 p.m. However, there may be occasions when meetings are held at the Board's office in the Metro Executive Building, 4201 Patterson Avenue, Baltimore. Attendance is essential.

Rad Tech Committee members serve staggered three-year terms. Members may be reappointed for a second term; however, an individual may not serve more than two consecutive three-year terms.

A candidate appointed to the Rad Tech Committee may not serve concurrently as a member of the Advisory Committee and as an elected officer in their professional association. ([Health Occupations Article §1-222\(b\)](#), Annotated Code of Maryland.)

Candidates will also be required to complete and submit a Biographical Information Form, an Appointee Exemption Disclosure Form, and a Candidate Questionnaire, which will be provided later in the application process.
