### CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK UPDATE

<u>Procedural Issue</u> - Ms. Farrelly described the previously Board-approved process of issuing a notice of intent to revoke if a licensee failed to submit to a CHRC and then failed to respond to numerous attempts by the Board to contact the licensee. Moving forward, Ms. Farrelly is requesting that in cases such as this, charges be issued rather than a notice of intent to revoke.

On a motion made by <u>Dr. Boursiquot</u>, and seconded by <u>Dr. Pereira</u>, the Board voted to unanimously <u>APPROVE</u> the issuance of charges for failure to submit to a CHRC.
