NEW BUSINESS

Physician Assistant Advanced Duties Addendums for Approval

The Physician Assistant Advisory Committee (PAAC) determined that the physician assistants meet the criteria for advanced duties established in statute and regulations, and voted to recommend approval of the addendum to the Board.

POLICY/LEGISLATION

Regulations

Proposed Regulations – Licensure of Genetic Counselors – Update

Ms. DelGreco presented amendments to draft regulations COMAR 10.32.24 Licensure of Genetic Counselors and sought approval from the Board to re-post the draft regulations with the amendments to the website to solicit public comment and, if no public comments are received, to proceed with the promulgation process. The Board voted to approve.

On a motion made by <u>Ms. Schaerr</u>, and seconded by <u>Dr. Ganti</u>, the Board voted to unanimously <u>APPROVE</u> re-posting these proposed regulations to the Board's website for public review and comments and if no comments are received to proceed with the promulgation process.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Ms. Farrelly mentioned that Board staff are working on/monitoring the following bills:

<u>Senate Bill 423/House Bill 776</u> - Maryland Medical Practice Act – Revisions ("General Revisions")

<u>Summary</u>: General Revisions standardizes language, codifies existing Board practices, removes duplicative, unclear, or outdated language, and authorizes certain substantial changes.

<u>Senate Bill 458/House Bill 783</u> - Health Occupations - Implicit Bias and Structural Racism Training

<u>Summary</u>: Requires applicants for renewal of certain licenses and certain certificates issued by certain health occupation boards to attest that the applicant completed an implicit bias and structural racism training program, rather than an implicit bias training program, approved by the Cultural and Linguistic Health Care Professional Competency Program; authorizes certain health occupations boards to adopt regulations allowing applicants renewing licenses to receive continuing education credits for completing certain training.

<u>Senate Bill 72/House Bill 367</u> - Health Occupations Boards - English Proficiency Requirements and Licensure by Endorsement for Nursing

Summary: This bill would establish requirements for health occupations boards that require evidence of English proficiency.

<u>Senate Bill 67</u> - Health Occupations Boards - Notation of Veteran Status and Eligibility for Benefits

<u>Summary</u>: This bill would require a health occupations board to notate a veteran's status on a license and to assist in determining eligibility for state and federal veterans benefits. No position, but worked with the sponsor on amendments.

<u>House Bill 482</u> - Occupational Licensing and Certification - Criminal History - Predetermination Review Process

<u>Summary</u>: Establishes a predetermination review process for occupational licenses and certificates in certain departments of State government; authorizes a department to charge a criminal history review fee of not more than \$100; and authorizes the fee to be waived if the individual's income is at or below 300% of the federal poverty level.

<u>House Bill 1199</u> - Physicians – Licensing – Internationally Trained Physicians <u>Summary</u>: Authorizes the State Board of Physicians, beginning October 1, 2027, to issue a license to practice medicine to an internationally trained physician under certain circumstances; requires the Board to adopt regulations establishing minimum qualifications and application fees and to provide a pathway to full licensure.
