UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Setting up of CPAP/BiPAP Machines – Draft FAQ

Dr. Brown presented two FAQs to the Respiratory Care Professional Standards Committee (RCPSC) to add to the Board's website for respiratory care practitioners. The RCPSC discussed both FAQs and determined that the second FAQ was unnecessary. The FAQ to be added to the website is as follows:

Question: Must delivery and setup of CPAP and BPAP devices be performed by a Respiratory Care Practitioner or Registered Polysomnography Technologist?

Answer: No. Setup of CPAP and BPAP devices are not solely limited to Respiratory Care Practitioners or Registered Polysomnography Technologists. Equipment is typically provided to patients through Durable Medical Equipment (DME) Companies. DME Companies follow guidance from their regulating authorities and are not regulated by this body.

On a motion made by Mr. French and seconded by Dr. Rabin the RCPSC unanimously voted to add the above FAQ to the Board's website.
