#### CALL TO ORDER

Dr. Bhandari, called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m.

Licensure - Special Purpose Examination (SPEX) for Reinstatement of Medical License - Howard M. Watzman, M.D.

The Licensure Practice of Medicine Committee is recommending that Dr. Watzman be required to take the SPEX since he meets all four criteria for taking the SPEX.

On a motion made by <u>Dr. Pereira</u>, and seconded by <u>Mr. Frank</u>, the Board voted unanimously to require Dr. Watzman to take the SPEX.

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#### POLICY/LEGISLATION

# Cardiovascular Invasive Specialists Workgroup

Ms. Van Horn, Ms. Darin, and Dr. Koya updated the Board on Cardiovascular Invasive Specialists (CIS) (Workgroup). They stated that the Workgroup had not reached a consensus on whether CIS' should be licensed in Maryland or whether an exemption to licensure should be created. However, the Workgroup did reach a consensus on several concepts related to patient safety, clinical duties, and practice settings. The Workgroup is scheduled to meet again on September 24, 2018, and a report is due to the legislature by October 31, 2018. Board staff will present the workgroup's findings and other information at the October 17, 2018 Panel meeting.

# Physician Assistant Dispensing Process and Regulations

Board staff distributed a preliminary draft of regulations and a recommended process regarding physician assistants and the dispensing of prescription medication under a physician's dispensing permit.

On a motion made by <u>Dr. Roca</u>, and seconded by <u>Dr. Bhandari</u>, the Board voted 13 to 6 to adopt the following minimum requirements for approval of dispensing as a delegated Advanced Duty of a PA and voted to delegate authority to the Physician Assistant Advisory Committee (PAAC) to approve dispensing as an advanced duty in cases where all of the conditions are met and PAAC will provide an FYI list to the Board each quarter.

#### A PA shall:

- 1. Possess a license to practice as a physician assistant in this State;
- 2. Be in good standing (as defined in the dispensing regulations);
- 3. Be of good moral character;
- 4. Demonstrate to the Board's satisfaction a basic knowledge of the statutes and regulations governing the practice of dispensing prescription drugs;
- 5. Complete a delegation agreement addendum for advanced duties on a form supplied by the Board;
- 6. Have at least one year of experience prescribing drugs as a physician assistant (with any supervising physician);
- 7. Have practiced under a delegation agreement with the proposed primary supervising physician and been delegated prescriptive authority by the primary supervising physician for at least 90 days prior to the request to dispense;
- 8. Be limited to dispense only those drugs that they are permitted to prescribe (prescriptive authority can be non-CDS, CDS or both);
- 9. Have dispensed at least 25 medications with direct, in-person supervision by the physician during the "final check" not including samples; and
- 10. Attest that they will abide by all Federal and State statutes and regulations regarding dispensing prescription drugs.
