NOMINATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP

he Maryland Board of Physicians is soliciting nominations for three physicians to fill Board member positions that will become vacant June 30, 2007. The position for a practicing physician with a full-time faculty appointment and one consumer position will also become vacant on that date. All current Board members whose appointments expire on June 30, 2007 are eligible for reappointment for a second term.

Physician nominees will be accepted from Maryland physician organizations representing at least 25 licensed physicians in the State. These nominations should be on the organization's letterhead and signed by the administrator of the organization. In addition, nominations will be accepted from individual Maryland licensed physicians who submit a valid petition signed by 25 Maryland licensed physicians. The petition should contain the candidate's name, address, license number, and signature; and the names, license numbers and signatures of the signers of the petition.

Maryland law requires the Governor to appoint the physician with a full-time faculty appointment from nominations submitted by the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and the University of Maryland School of Medicine. Consumer members are identified by the Governor's Office.

Nominations and petitions must include a completed biographical information form and resume or curriculum vitae of the nominee. The form may be downloaded from the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene website: www.dhmh.state.md.us\execonom.

The Department is committed to obtaining increased gender, geographical and minority representation on each of the Boards, Commissions and Task Forces.

Valid nominations and petitions will be forwarded to the Governor who appoints Board members with the advice and consent of the Senate.

BOARD'S DECLARATORY RULING ON SELF REFERRALS FOR MRI SCANS

On March 22, 2006, the Board decided to grant two petitions for Declaratory Rulings filed separately by CareFirst BlueCross BlueShield and the Injured Workers' Insurance Fund and later joined by six medical practices as interested parties. The petitions asked the Board for a ruling on the propriety under the Maryland Self Referral Law of referrals made by physicians for MRI scans when that physician may obtain a financial benefit from the performance of that scan. The Declaratory Ruling is expected to become available shortly after the first of the year at the Board's website. Earlier, in the Summer, 2004 issue of the Board's Newsletter, the Board published an article entitled, "Attorney General's Opinion on Self Referrals." In the Spring, 2005 Newsletter, the Board published another article entitled, "Board Action on MRI Scans and Self Referrals." These two articles have been withdrawn.

BOARD PROPOSES REGULATIONS FOR TELEMEDICINE

The Board of Physicians has developed proposed regulations governing the practice of medicine when the practice incorporates telecommunications systems to enhance or replace traditional face-to-face patient visits. These regulations would apply to the practice of medicine if either the patient or the physician is in Maryland and require the physician to hold an active Maryland license in either case.

The proposed regulations are expected to be published in the January 5, 2007 edition of the Maryland Register for public comment and will also be available on the Board's website at that time. PHYSICIAN DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

Michael L. Beavers, D.O.

Area of Practice: Anesthesiology (Berlin, MD)

Date of Action: October 31, 2006

Summary Suspension. The Board determined that the public health, safety or welfare imperatively required emergency action based on the physician's admission of his addiction to certain CDS; his diverting these drugs from a hospital medication management system and putting false information in patient medical records to do so; his abuse of prescription medications; and having provided professional services while under the influence of drugs.

Summary Suspension. The Board concluded that the physician's continued licensure in the state constitutes a danger to the public health, safety or welfare. The Board's action is based on investigative findings that the physician engaged in repeated, overtly sexual communications with an individual he believed to be 14 years old, made inquires about meeting him, traveled across state lines for this purpose, and upon arrival attempted to follow the purported individual to the second floor of the premises; suspensions by the California and New York medical boards for the same actions; termination from employment by an emergency medicine physician group; and acts of unprofessional conduct in his practice of medicine in Maryland at the hospital where he worked; and inappropriately providing medical care and/or medication without maintaining or safeguarding a medical record.

Reprimand; a condition. The Board concluded that

by failing to perform adequately his duties as an anesthesiologist for a patient the physician thereby failed to meet standards of quality care.

Reprimand; Probation until terms and conditions are satisfied. The Board found that the physician failed to meet standards of quality care in his practice of family medicine in regard to three patients and the issue of annual colorectal cancer screening.

Date of Action: July 14, 2006

Suspension for a minimum of 2 years, with all but a minimum of 6 months stayed; terms and conditions; and a \$10,000 fine. The Board concluded that the physician, by failing to keep adequate medical records, by prescribing dangerous drugs inappropriately over a long period of time, by engaging in repeated, egregious, and long standing violations of professional boundaries with the same patient to whom he was inappropriately prescribing dangerous drugs, together with additional boundary violations with other patients, committed immoral and unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine, failed to meet appropriate standards for the delivery of quality medical care, and failed to keep adequate medical records within the meaning of the Medical Practice Act.

Suspension until physician's license is reinstated in Georgia; if reinstated in Georgia the physician may submit a written petition to reinstate in Maryland. The Maryland Board took reciprocal action on a suspension by the Georgia Board because of the physician's relapse in regard in to substance abuse; the Maryland Board also found that the physician violated his Maryland Disposition Agreement relating to substance abuse issues.

The Board determined that the physician's history includes a series of events that cast grave doubt on his competence to practice medicine.

The Board granted licensure because the physician has had more than five years sobriety and abstinence from mood altering substances and will be monitored for a significant period of time and until he holds an unrestricted medical license in Georgia.

DISPENSING PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

Physicians thinking about dispensing medications, other than samples, from the office, should review the Board's Application for Permit to Dispense Prescription Drugs. This packet of information contains copies of the statutes and regulations that govern dispensing in Maryland and includes a summary of the requirements. Applicants must certify that they have read and understand all the requirements that include the labeling of containers, file maintenance, handling of expired drugs, inventory and record retention. Physicians dispensing medications must post a notice in the waiting room of the office stating that medications may be filled in the office or at a pharmacy of the patient's choice. There are currently 634 dispensing permits in effect. Dispensing permits are issued for a period of five years and costs \$50 to apply.

ALLIED HEALTH RENEWAL

2007 is the renewal year for Radiation Oncology/Therapy Technologists (RT), Medical Radiation Technologists (MRT), Nuclear Medicine Technologists (NMT), and Physician Assistants (PA). RT, MRT, and NMT licenses expire on April 30, 2007. PA licenses expire on June 30, 2007. The Board will notify practitioners at least one month prior to renewal that the license will expire. The Board will mail the notification to the last address the practitioner supplied to the Board. If you are planning to move before the Board mails the renewal notice, be sure to update your address. You may update your address by going to the Board's website at http://www.mbp.state.md.us/forms/ah chg adr.pdf and downloading a copy of an address change form. You may also update your address online at https://www.mbp.state.md.us/bpgapp.

Unless this is the first renewal after initial certification or the first renewal after reinstatement, practitioners are required to earn continuing education hours. Continuing education hours must be earned within the 2-year period preceding the submission of the renewal application. RTs, MRTs, and NMTs need 24 continuing education hours. Additional requirements for RT, MRT and NMT renewal are available at http://www.dsd.state.md.us/comar/10/10.32.10.09.htm. PAs need 100 continuing education hours, with at least 40 in Category I. Additional requirements for PA renewal are available at http://www.dsd.state.md.us/comar/10/10.32.03.09.htm.

Before the Board renews a certificate, Maryland law (Health Occupations Article, §1-213) requires the Board to verify with the Comptroller that the practitioner has no outstanding tax delinquency. Practitioners with tax delinquencies are notified in advance of the renewal period so that they can contact the Comptroller and make arrangements for payment. The Board is required to deny the renewal application of a practitioner who does not make arrangements for payment with the Comptroller before the end of the renewal period. Thereafter, the practitioner would have to go through the reinstatement process in order to practice. Practitioners are not authorized to practice unless their certificates have been renewed or reinstated.

NPI INFORMATION

By May 23, 2007, medical providers must obtain and begin to use a National Provider Identifier (NPI) as required by the federal Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) regulations. A number of educational materials are available at the website of the Maryland Health Care Commission (MHCC) to help providers understand the requirements and make the necessary changes in office procedures to achieve a successful NPI implementation.
